Gabe cites his main living influences as John Clayton and Christian McBride, although his appreciation for bass extends farther back to such greats as Milt Hinton, Scott LaFaro and Ray Brown. Gabe maintains great respect for the lineage and history of jazz, which he tries to reflect and preserve in his sound. He feels jazz is a microcosm of the story of the United States, and a complete reflection of the human experience. Gabe is excited to share his music with the world and dedicates his life to continuing and protecting one of the greatest art forms ever created: Jazz.

Gabe is passionate individual; he strives to use this passion not only in his music, but also in his desire to better humanity and learn from those around him. Gabe has participated in many benefit concerts and programs aimed at improving lives, including El Sistema, and his most recent cultural exchange with Habitat for Humanity in Paraguay. As a deeply spiritual and open-hearted person, Gabe believes that it is an artist's duty to be a messenger of joy and unity. He believes that showing compassion to others is a fundamental element of the universe, and through his art and his outreach, he hopes to reflect this.
